

Title of the Paper

Abstract

The abstract must be in fully-justified italicized text, using Times New Roman 12-point font. Leave one blank line after the abstract. Please select 4 to 5 keywords, separated by commas. Use Times New Roman 12-point font for the selected keywords. Leave one blank line after the keywords. The abstract should not exceed 250 words.

Keywords: Keyword 1, Keyword 2, Keyword 3, Keyword 4, Keyword 5

All manuscripts must be written in English and submitted through the online submission system in PDF or Microsoft Word format only in order to facilitate the creation of workshop brochure. Complete research papers should be no more than 12 pages in length, including the abstract, text, figures, tables, and references. Short research-in-progress papers should not exceed 7 pages. The first page of the paper should include the title and the abstract. Please do not disclose any author information in the manuscript.

Main Text

Main text should be in 12-point Times New Roman, single-spaced, with 1-inch margin on each side. Please make sure your text is fully justified; that is, flush left and flush right. Avoid the use of footnotes¹.

First-level Headings

First-level headings should be Times New Roman 12-point boldface, initially capitalized, flush left, with one blank line above. Use a period (".") after the heading number, not a colon.

Second-level Headings

Second-level headings should be Times New Roman 12-point boldface, initially capitalized, italicized, flush left, with one blank line above.

Cite references in the text by name and year in parentheses. Some examples:

- Negotiation research spans many disciplines (Thompson 1990).
- This result was later contradicted by Becker and Seligman (1996).
- This effect has been widely studied (Abbott 1991; Barakat et al. 1995; Kelso and Smith 1998; Medvec et al. 1993).

Reference list

The list of references should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Personal communications and unpublished works should only be mentioned in the text. Do not use footnotes or endnotes as a substitute for a reference list.

¹ Avoid the use of footnotes. If you must use them, place them at the bottom of the page on which they are referenced. Use Times New Roman 9-point type, single-spaced.

Reference list entries should be alphabetized by the last names of the first author of each work.
